Tulip tree, also known as tulip poplar or yellow poplar, is the tallest deciduous tree in North America and native to the eastern U.S. It is a fast-growing tree with bright green leaves that resemble tulip flowers in profile and turn golden yellow in fall.

Height: 70-90 ft.

Spread: 40 ft.

Foliage: Deciduous

Flower: Unique, tulip-shaped, yellow-orange flowers.¹
